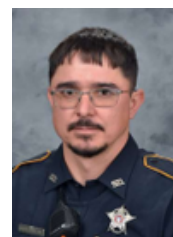

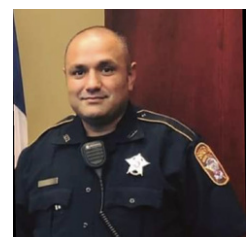

FAQs

Students who are **RETURNING** to CSISD need to complete the online registration process, which can be found at www.csisd.org --> Online Enrollment tab. You will use your unique SnapCode, or registration password, that was emailed to you by CSISD to login. If you do not have access to a computer / internet, please contact the CSHS front office at (979)-694-5800 for assistance.

Students who are **NEW** to the school district completed the InfoSnap process in person as part of your new enrollment meeting with our Registrar, Mrs. Starrett. As a result, your InfoSnap is complete.



As per CSISD School Board Policy FNF (LOCAL), students in grades 9-12 who participate in extracurricular activities, as well as those who wish to purchase a parking pass, will be subject to random drug testing. In addition, parents can voluntarily opt their student into the drug testing program if they do not meet one of the aforementioned criteria. Consent for participation in the student drug testing program is now part of the InfoSnap registration process.

INFOSNAP CONT'D

ALL students MUST attend our in-person schedule pick-up (see schedules below) with their InfoSnap completed to receive their schedules. Failure to have submitted the InfoSnap will prevent the student from securing his or her schedule.

NEW: Please note that proof of residency documentation is required for ALL students this year.

GET READY FOR NEXT YEAR!

Future 9th Graders:

- Make sure you are checking Schoology regularly once the school year begins. Many announcements will be posted on the **Class of 2027 group**.
- Get involved! Join a club or school team. Keep an eye on the announcements at **cs.hs.csisd.org** and signs around school for invitations to club meetings.

*By the end of 9th grade, you must earn **at least 5.5 credits**. ATTENDANCE COUNTS! If you miss too many days, you will need to make up the hours, or you may not get credit.*

Future 10th Graders:

You must have at least 5.5 credits to be considered a 10th grader in August.

- Make sure you earned your credits last year. If you failed any classes, visit with your counselor to come up with a plan.
- Make sure you are following the Class of 2026 Group on Schoology.
- Create a student resume, and continue adding to it throughout high school. This will help you when you apply to college.
- Participate in school activities, find ways to volunteer in the community, find something you're passionate about and invest time into it!
- Visit BigFuture.org, and explore different careers and colleges. Think about what you'd like to do after high school.
- Just a heads up, you'll have the opportunity to take the PSAT in October. This is just a practice and will not count for anything.
- By the end of 10th grade, you must have at least 11 credits.

Future 11th Graders:

You must have at least 11 credits to be considered an 11th grader in August.

At the end of this year, your GPA and class rank is what your colleges will see when you apply in the fall of your senior year! CHECK your transcript to make sure you have your required credits. By the end of 11th grade, you must earn a minimum of 17 credits.

- Make sure you are following the Class of 2025 Group on Schoology.
- OCTOBER: All 11th graders will take the PSAT.
Save the Date: College & Career Night! Monday, October 23, 2023! More info coming soon!
- Spring: Take the SAT, ACT, or TSI. The SAT/ACT is for students who plan to apply to a 4-year university. The TSI is for students who plan to apply to a 2-year college or other vocational program after high school. Your scores must meet college-readiness standards. In order to take Dual Credit courses in 12th grade, you must have qualifying scores before May.
- Athletes interested will need to create an NCAA account online.
- You have two excused absence for College Visits. Talk to the attendance office if you plan to do a college visit.
- Visit BigFuture.org to get lots of information about colleges, scholarships, and careers!



GET READY FOR NEXT YEAR!

Future 12th Graders:

You must have at least 17 credits to be considered a 12th grader in August.

Make sure you are following the Class of 2024 group on Schoology. MANY important announcements about senior events (like Senior pictures, trips, and graduation) will be posted here.

Check your report card and transcript! If you have failed any classes, meet with your counselor to make sure you have a plan to make up the credits you need to graduate!

AUGUST: Senior pictures are taken in August. Please see the Schoology Group for more info.

Begin working on college applications.

- Create a Common Application account and/or Apply Texas account.
- If you plan to apply to any colleges that are not covered by the Common Application or Apply Texas, visit that college's website to see what is required.

Seniors have TWO excused absences for College Visits.

Military recruiters visit campus periodically, and you can visit with them at lunch.

SEPTEMBER: Create a FAFSA account. All seniors will be required to fill this out. You'll need your social security number and your guardian's tax return W-2 form to complete your FAFSA application.

Apply for scholarships. Many are listed on the CSHS Counseling website, and a lot are available in our community! Apply for as many as you can!

Ask for recommendation letters from your teachers, counselors, coaches, etc.

Write your college essays and ask for help with editing those!

OCTOBER: Fill out your FAFSA application and submit. We will have hep sessions on campus.

Save the Date: College & Career Night! Monday, October 23, 2023! More info coming soon!

Before December: Take the SAT / ACT / or TSI (if you haven't already taken this). The SAT/ACT is for students who plan to apply to a 4-year university. The TSI is for students who plan to apply to a 2-year college or other vocational program after high school.

If you plan to enlist in the military, there is a test called the ASVAB that you can take. Talk to your counselor for more info.

Your goal should be to have your applications for college submitted by December 1. Make sure you look at your college's requirements, in case they have earlier deadlines.

Finish strong! Whether you plan to go to college, start a career, or enlist in the military, you must pass your classes to graduate!

SCHEDULE PICK-UP PREP ITEMS

- **Register in InfoSnap:** See prior information
- **Provide Proof of Residency (required):** All students will need to provide documentation as POR. This could be a current utility bill, cable/satellite bill, or residential lease.
- **Student ID's / Lanyards Fees (required):** There is an \$8 charge for student ID's and a lanyard. Students will be provided an ID at the beginning of both semesters. Photographs will be taken during schedule pick-up for any students who do not have a photo in our system.
- **Medical Information (required):** Per the Texas Department of Health Services, students must show acceptable evidence of immunization prior to entry, attendance, or transfer to a public school in Texas. Payment for all current required fees and ID's, and optional items such as parking tags, along with fines/textbook collection from the previous school year will be available during schedule pick-up. Cash, check, and credit card payments will be accepted, **but credit card payments are preferred.**

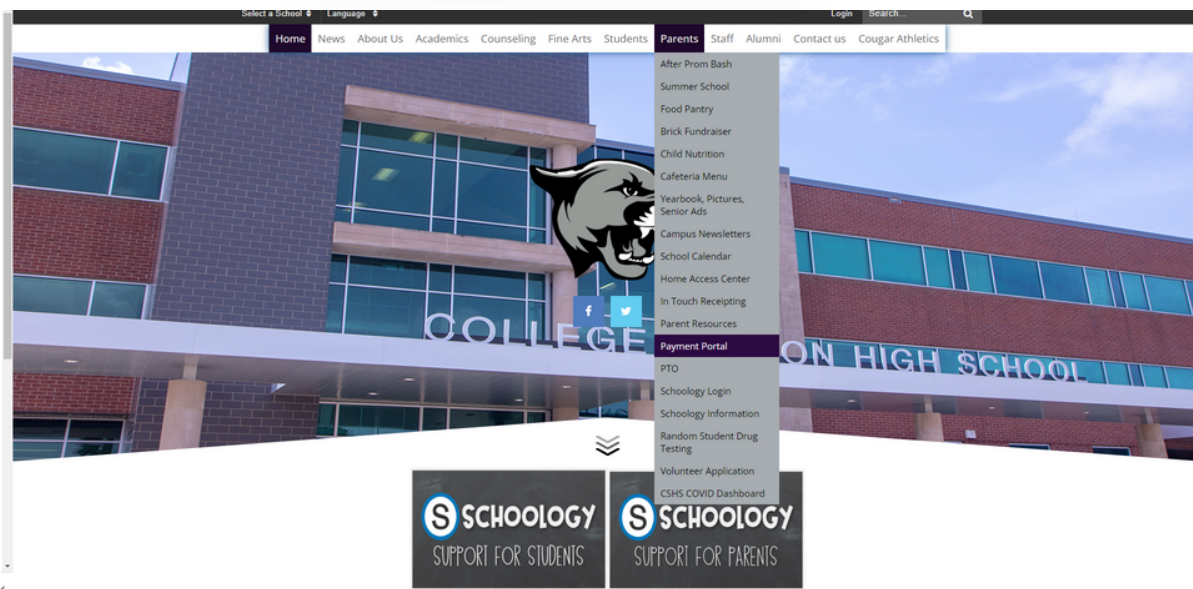

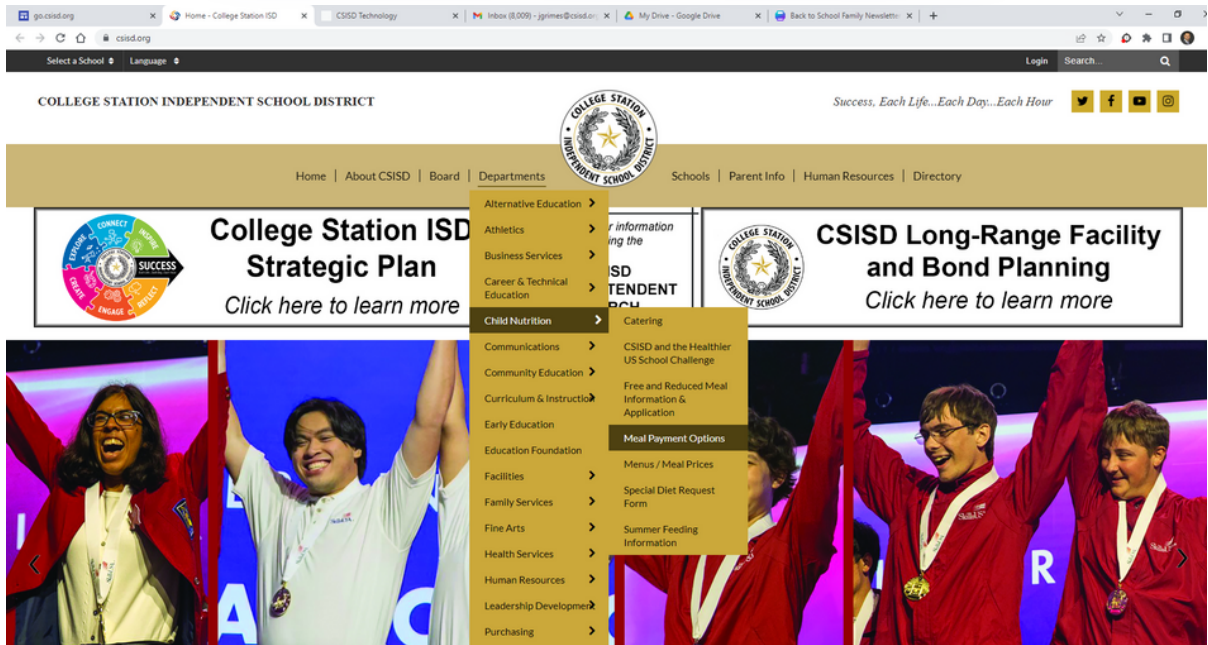

Class of 2027 - GPA / Class rank

Academic Achievement & Class Rank in CSISD

CSISD Board Policy EIC (Local)

CSISD Board Policy EIC (Local) is the Academic Achievement & Class Rank policy that provides the parameters for how we calculate Grade Point Averages, set tiers and weights of courses, and determine graduation honors. In the 2021-22 school year, a committee of students, parents, community members and educators revised this policy, and these changes are being implemented with the Class of 2027.



What is a grade point average (GPA)?



Grade point averages measure academic achievement by contextualizing individual student performance by comparing student to others in the same graduating class.

How is a GPA used?



GPA's are used for class rank and to illustrate the level of rigor or difficulty of courses taken. This is important for college admissions, scholarship eligibility, and for local graduation honors.

How will GPA be calculated for the Class of 2027 & beyond?

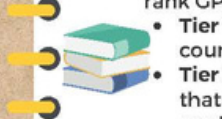
For the calculation of class rank GPA, grades earned in eligible high school credit courses taken at any grade level will be included. Semester grades used in the calculation of class rank will include the following courses:

- Up to eight semesters each of English, mathematics, science, and social studies;
- Up to two semesters of languages other than English.

If a student completes more than the number of semesters listed above, the class rank calculation will include the eligible semester grades within each category with the highest converted grade point value.



How will course grades be weighted?



Courses eligible to be included in the class rank GPA will be weighted as follows:

- **Tier 1 (6.0):** Advanced Placement courses
- **Tier 2 (5.5):** eligible dual credit (courses that count for college & high school credit) and advanced courses
- **Tier 3 (5.0):** all other eligible courses

What will be on student transcripts?



All courses in which a student earns high school credit toward graduation will continue to be included on the student's transcript, or academic record. Each student's class rank and GPA as calculated by this policy will also be printed on the transcript and updated at the end of each semester.

How are elective credit courses considered?

While elective credit courses, such as fine arts, career and technical education, and physical education will not be included in the class rank GPA calculation, they are important to the development of well rounded students and are necessary to meet graduation requirements. Grades in these courses have been and will continue to be included on transcripts. Colleges and universities may consider these courses in holistic review. In some cases, students may be asked to submit an unweighted cumulative GPA for college and scholarship applications, and this will be provided by request.

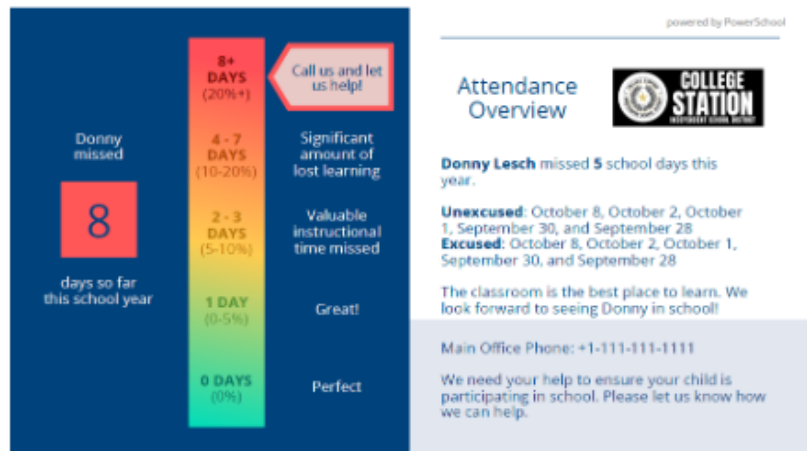

Greetings!

We wanted to let you know about an exciting new program being launched in CSISD, Unified Home Communications, or UHC for short. Unified Home Communications is a communication system that allows CSISD to easily text and email you information about your child's attendance in your preferred language.

As a CSISD parent/guardian, what should you expect?

- At the middle of each month, you will receive an email (sent from an email that begins with kinv followed by a number) with a digital attendance postcard for your child that lists the number of excused and unexcused absences similar to this:



- If your child meets any of the criteria listed below, you'll receive an email with a letter regarding their attendance in school.
 - 3 or more absences- excused OR unexcused
 - 3, 4, or 5 UNexcused absences in a 4 week period
 - 6, 7, 8, or 9 UNexcused absences in a semester
 - 10+ UNexcused absences

Please note that families whose students have excessive unexcused absences will receive multiple letters.

Important Details about UHC:

- Emails from UHC are sent from an email that begins with **kinv** followed by a long number
- Your messages to and from the district in UHC can be translated into your language of preference. To have the language changed for your messages, just email uhc@csisd.org with your child's first and last name and your language of preference
